1. Annual Report - Ben Dare

Ben's report covered the team's key activities in the 2017-2018 year. Notably, this included mention of Conor and Sarwan's deaths. Ben also discussed team trips, and other expeditions or achievements by team members. This included multiple trips to Yosemite, an expedition to the Khumbu (supported by the ECC Capital fund), new routes on the South Face of Huxley, South Face of Sabre, and South Face of Aoraki, Patagonia expedition, Ice climbing in the Canadian Rockies, climbing in Chamonix, Rose & Brette Harrington on W Face Mt Blane and other general trips throughout New Zealand. Ben also touched on matters of ECC Capital Fund, future trips, the standing of the team and direction going forward, and the results of the internal review that was conducted around Conor and Sarwan's accident by Paul Rogers and Hugh Logan. Finally, Ben noted the success of the last festival, including the funds raised for the Expedition Capital Fund, and he looked ahead to the events of this festival, which has the highest anticipated turnout yet. Ben also noted the changes to the NZAT organisational structure that were underway.

Ben raised a motion that the minutes from the 2017 AGM, including the financial report, be accepted in their entirety. Seconded by Daniel Joll, passed unanimously.

Motion to accept president's report moved by Jaz Morris, seconded by Alastair McDowell – passed unanimously.

2. Treasurer's Report - Daniel Joll

Daniel presented the club's financial position from a separate report, that will be attached to these minutes and marked Appendix A. Generally, Daniel noted the financial position of the Club to be very healthy, with the festival (by way of its members and their membership fees) being the main

revenue stream, alongside some other donations and additional club memberships. One point Daniel raised was the changes to the festival structure, in the way that food is ordered and the free beer that is provided to club members at the festival. He spoke to the financial justification for this, and how it wasn't economically justifiable for the festival to keep spending its money on a caterer when insufficient people were ordering food from them.

Finally, Daniel noted an accounting error, which had left a small discrepancy in the accounts, but was irreconcilable, and he proposed to simply accept the discrepancy if passed by the AGM.

Motion to accept the treasurer's report (as attached to these minutes) moved by Steven Fortune, seconded by Karl Schimanski – passed unanimously.

3. NZAT Subcommittee Report – Steven Fortune

Steve briefly touched on matters raised by Ben, including the review of Conor and Sarwan's accident, the internal review. He also recounted the team trips and success on many of these.

Looking forward, Steve spoke of the application process that was beginning, with some of the potential recruits for the 2019 team being at the festival. He then worked through the application and trial process, and outlined timeframes for these. Finally, Steve mentioned that it was anticipated that a new club would be being set up to incorporate the team under a separate umbrella, as both the ECC and the NZAT were becoming distinct and large enough entities to exist individually, and this would ensure independence from each other going forward. Likely changes coming in the next year with regards to the team management structure.

Motion to accept the NZAT Team Captain's Report moved by Gemma Wilson, seconded by Jono Clarke.

4. Festival & Events Subcommittee Report – Rose Pearson

Rose highlighted the aspects of the RIMF 2017 and upcoming RIMF 2018 as previously alluded to by Ben. This included some instructor changes, and the forecast for the future in terms of instructors, and the need for a deep instructor pool to call upon in future years. Particularly, the changing nature of Chicks and Picks was considered, as well as the difficulties in lean years with instruction Chicks and Picks, as well as ice clinics in the same location. This was agreed to be something that could be discussed in further detail in the instructor briefing to follow.

Otherwise, Rose noted the health of the primary event that the club runs (RIMF), but contrasted this somewhat against some of the attempts to run other events throughout the year. She noted a lack of interest or engagement by members historically to attend events like rock climbing at long beach, or cloud peak etc. It was suggested that these types of trips were already catered for by smaller, local clubs or branches of clubs. The ongoing matter was raised that part of the attraction of RIMF is its predictability, and sign-ups with dates are scheduled almost a year in advance, allowing people plenty of time to make plans and arrange to attend. This can often lead to many Australians attending and to an extent taking over the event, but at this stage this wasn't seen to be an issue. It was agreed that the focus of the club in terms of events remains on RIMF, although there are opportunities for other trips to be considered, if someone wants to organise them. Rose noted that she is happy to continue in the role, but has limited desire to substantially organise other trips given past lack of desire for them.

Festival and events subcommittee report moved by Alastair McDowell, seconded by Ben Dare, passed unanimously.

5. Publications subcommittee report - Alastair McDowell

Alastair briefly noted the continued health of the NZAT website as one of the primary mediums for getting information out about trips, expeditions, advice and reviews. He also was commended by Daniel for the improvements made over the past year to the ECC and RIMF websites, with them facilitating easier registration and information about the club, its structure, and key dates, events and information.

Alastair noted ongoing website backend work to be done, but nothing substantial of note in the future on the publication front.

Publication subcommittee report moved by Sooji Clarkson, seconded by Rose Pearson – passed unanimously.

6. Constitutional amendments

None proposed, and none raised at the AGM.

7. General Business

- a) Matter of price changes for ECC membership: Daniel had touched on this in his treasurer's report, but again, he spoke to the reason for raising the price notably that it hasn't been raised in many years of running the festival, and the fact that it needed to cover some of the increasing costs, like room hire and the free alcohol.
 - Motion moved to accept the raised cost of ECC membership Ben Dare; Seconded Jaz Morris, passed unanimously.
- b) Matter of trips to be voted on for the 2018 ECC Expedition Capital Fund Grant: General overview of the trips that were to be presented at the festival for a vote on receipt of the 2018 grant. Three trips were proposed and the AGM to assess whether they were eligible for the grant:
 - (i) Alastair McDowell & Gemma Wilson trip to Alaska to climb new routes in the Kitchatna Mountains
 - (ii) Daniel Joll trip to Patagonia

All three trips were accepted to meet the eligibility criteria for presentation at the Festival.

8. Election of positions for 2018-2019 year

President is a 3-year fixed term role, and Ben Dare was re-elected in 2016, so his term expires in 2019.
